

Implementation of 2024 HB 2648 for Regulations Already In Process

For agencies who have already published a notice of public hearing on proposed regulations that takes place before July 1:

- If you are able to file the stamped regulations, economic impact statement, and adoption certificate required by the rules and regulations filing act with the Secretary of State before July 1, 2024, you will not be impacted by 2024 HB 2648.
- If you are unable to file the required documents before July 1, and your regulations are NOT federally mandated, you will need to submit the original stamped regulations and an amended economic impact statement on the new form to the Office of the Budget for approval on July 1 or after.
 - If your EIS shows an estimated cost **below** the new threshold and it is approved by Budget, it may be filed with the Secretary of State with the other necessary documents.
 - If your EIS shows an estimated cost above the new threshold,
 - the regulations may be modified to reduce the economic impact, **but any regulation with changes will need to start the approval and hearing process over again**, or
 - the agency may find a legislator to introduce and carry a bill to ratify their regulations during the next legislative session.
- If your regulations are federally mandated, you will need to fill out the new EIS form, but you will not need to have the EIS or regulations stamped by Budget.

For agencies who are close to receiving the necessary approvals and want to publish a notice of public hearing on proposed regulations before July 1:

- You must submit all the required documentation for publication of your notice to the Secretary of State on or before noon on June 20.
- If your regulations are NOT federally mandated, you will need to submit the original stamped regulations and an amended economic impact statement on the new form to the Office of the Budget for approval on July 1 or after.
 - If your EIS shows an estimated cost **below** the new threshold and it is approved by Budget, it may be filed with the Secretary of State with the other necessary documents after your hearing.
